# Membership Meeting Thursday August 15, 2024 7:00 p.m. Garden Center, Tyrrell Park, Beaumont Christine Brouwer From the Netherlands to Nederland

Christine Brouwer was born and raised in the Netherlands. Her childhood homes were in the countryside, and from a very young age, her father, who was a nature preserver, introduced her to a deeper love for nature. He always pointed out birds, flowers, and wildlife, which gave her an eye for special birds and other wildlife.

Her home was also far away from school. This meant she had to ride her bike throughout her school career, and that developed her passion for cycling and the technology behind it. This passion led her to obtain an education and become a professional in mechanical engineering. But always spending as much time in nature with her family, and there were no vacations without binoculars!

Her profession led her to work in the Beaumont area as a project manager at BASF and she lived in Beaumont from 2013-2018. During that time, she got to know her now husband, Mark Screen, and has lived in Port Neches since the summer of 2021. While waiting for her work permit, she picked up birding during the spring migration when a beautiful Rose-breasted Grosbeak visited her backyard. It was hard for her to ID all the new birds, and her next step was to use a camera to take pictures and make ID easier. That turns up the birding a notch! The old love for birds sparked! She maintains a spreadsheet with bird sightings and a photo gallery with her pictures. Last May, she was able to take her camera to the Netherlands and was excited to take photos of the most normal birds and some rare visitors.

Taking pictures of the most ordinary ones felt to her like seeing a special Warbler! In her presentation, she plans to compare Southeast Texas to her home country. And surprisingly there are many similarities. She also has three adult children, all of whom live in the Netherlands: two girls, who are both engaged, and a son, who is still a student. They are frequent visitors along with her mom and dad to visit her and her sister, who lives in Houston.

We plan to have the doors open no later than 6:00 p.m., the meeting will start at 7:00 p.m. sharp.

### Future Programs and Field Trips.

Thursday August 15, 2024. Membership Meeting. Further details on page 1.

Saturday August 24, 2024. Date one week later than usual. Field Trip to Bolivar Flats. Meet the leaders at the vehicle barrier at Bolivar Flats at 8:30 a.m. Take Highway 124 south from Winnie about 20 miles through High Island. At the shoreline, turn right along Highway 87 and proceed approximately 25 miles through Gilchrist and Crystal Beach until you come to the intersection with Loop 108. At that intersection, turn left (south – the opposite direction from Loop 108) on Rettilon Road to the beach. If conditions permit, drive onto the sand and turn right to the vehicle barrier (about 1/2 mile). It is about a 90minute drive from Beaumont or mid-County to the Flats (if you don't stop to bird on the way!)

Depending on the tide -- high tide is forecast for 7:29 a.m.-- it may not be far to walk to the water's edge.

Often, after birding the flats, the group proceeds to the Big Store or to Fort Travis to use the facilities and eat lunch. Many participants will bring their lunch, as options to purchase are limited.

The group may stop at Rollover Pass and may possibly visit High Island on the way home, checking there for very early southbound migrants

To park on the beach, you will need a Galveston County Beach Parking Permit, obtainable for \$10 from most merchants on the Peninsula. (The Big Store opens at 7:00 a.m.)

### Bird Sightings - June and July 2024

For this column, we review, looking for rare and very rare species, all credible eBird and other records reported to us from nearby Texas counties – Angelina, Hardin, Jasper, Jefferson, Newton, Orange, Sabine, San Augustine and Tyler. We also review records for Chambers, Galveston, Harris and Liberty Counties in Texas, and Calcasieu and Cameron Parishes in Louisiana.

The format of the listing is Species – Date – County-and brief location information if available – (number) – Observer(s). If more precise location information is needed, it can often be obtained by using the bird species map feature to find the sighting in eBird, opening the checklist, and using the map function to display the location as precisely as the observer provided.

**Commentary**: A surprisingly long list of unusual birds for June and July. Inevitably, the July list is dominated by early migrants which typically include many failed breeders, and especially shorebirds.

We are considering changing our criteria for inclusion in these columns to focus on species which are rare at any time during the year. In the list below, a good number of such species are listed, but the list also includes species that, while they are more than one week before or after the normal migration period (our current criterion for inclusion), are nonetheless at least uncommon or rare at some other time of the year. These would likely mostly include birds injured during migration and unable to continue migration, or are recovering from a less serious injury.

### RARE BIRD ALERTS

Unfortunately, almost all the local and regional telephone Rare Bird Alerts have been discontinued in favor of various forms of Internet distribution.

The Texas-wide Rare Bird Alert, maintained by Houston Audubon Society, is available on their web-site at http://www.houstonaudubon.org/
Email alerts are also available for a fee.

Many rare bird sightings in Texas are posted on Facebook Texbirds or on the TEXBIRDS listserv. Archives of the listserv are at **www.freelists.org/archive/texbirds**. It is not necessary to subscribe to view the archives, which include all recent postings.

Detailed information/maps on birding sites in Texas is available on the Web at http://www.texasbirds.org/birdingLo cations.php. This leads you to the maps of the various eBird hotspots. You can also subscribe (free) on eBird for email alerts for all rare birds reported in a specific county.

### **Spring 2024 Migration at Sabine Woods**

The information available on migrants passing through Sabine Woods this spring presented us with significant challenges and changes over the preceding migration seasons. As such, attempting to present a meaningful summary in the limited space available in the printed version of the Brown Pelican is very difficult. However, we are able to present here in this digital version a more comprehensive and expanded account.

### **Data Sources and Issues**

Our goal in this summary is to present lists and some comments that facilitate comparison with the accounts we have presented in previous years. The number of checklists entered into eBird this year increased yet again. As in previous years, we excluded lists that included species that were not reported on that day by any other observer (with observer groups submitting identical checklists treated as a single observer) on days when multiple checklists were submitted. If there are enough such lists, all lists submitted by that observer are excluded.

While most of these submissions were made in good faith, many more inexperienced observers are now submitting to eBird. Relatively few were simple misidentifications. One problem, applicable mostly to shore and waterbirds that are in any case excluded from many of our tables, are observations that were not made in (or from) Sabine Woods as strictly defined. Another issue involves birds that are "heard only." There are some species that can be identified by experienced observers with confidence based on the call. However, there is at least one (perhaps more than one) Northern Mockingbird in the Sabine Woods area that is able to mimic the call(s) of several other species with such remarkable fidelity that it "fools" Merlin and other call analysis programs. Unfortunately, not all eBird submissions identify which species were identified by Merlin or were just call only. All conscientious observers should enter "heard only" or "identified by Merlin" in the details field of their eBird checklists! Note that "confirmed by Merlin" can be valuable additional information and alone should not disqualify the identification. It is now apparently eBird policy not to enter "Merlin only" observations into its main database.

There are some species that are all too frequently entered into eBird Sabine Woods checklists that require careful validation but that are not marked as rare by eBird, in large part because they are reasonably common in parts of Jefferson County a little further north of the immediate coast. Examples of this include Tufted Titmouse. There is a thoroughly validated report of one on a CBC some years ago, but no others! Other reports are presumably based on calls only. Carolina Wrens were resident in Sabine Woods through 2021, but there are no reports by local observers since then. We believe subsequent reports were based on calls of birds that were actually House Wrens. Interestingly enough, there is one (presumably only one) Carolina Chickadee that has been that has been resident in Sabine Woods for several years, but has been visited by one or two others a couple of times in early spring. During migration season, this one chickadee is often the leader of a feeding flock (to use the winter analogy) in the Woods. It is well worth checking the area near where the chickadee is calling! But we believe that reports of more than one are mostly in error. While Fish Crows are very

occasionally encountered along the coast of Jefferson County, American Crows are not!

Then there is the ongoing problem of Louisiana versus Northern Waterthrush identification. Field Guides long focused on the presence or absence of streaking on the throat of the Louisiana, while this is probably one of the least accurate and least easily used morphological features, especially in the spring. If the bird can be seen well for a short period, the tail movement -- slow, circular and "exaggerated" in the Louisiana and quick up and down in the Northern -- is by far the easiest feature to use to separate the species. But for the Louisiana, look also for the up-turn at the distal end of the brighter white supercilium, the bright bubble-gum-red legs (if clean!), the larger bill, the buff coloration of the flanks, and the lower number and broader nature of the streaks on the breast and belly. These differences are listed in order of increasing difficulty to use. This year, the core overlap period was April 7 to 12, but there are often one or two Louisiana Waterthrushes (which can be found nesting 20 or 30 miles further north) which find the Sabine Woods habitat to their liking, and hang around looking for a mate, and there is always a Northern Waterthrush, probably a male, that arrives in the US early.

In cases where the numbers reported for most species are more than two or three times those reported by others for the same species, the checklist obviously cannot be used. An abnormal number of a single species, if there is an explanatory comment, is obviously "acceptable" for our analysis. Numbers for species which travel in larger compact flocks are treated accordingly.

In 2024, eBird shows just over 60,000 individual entries, versus just under 34,000 in 2024. To make our analyses more comparable to previous years, we have in our prime compilation this year limited our entries to those submitted to eBird by about a dozen local observers who visited the Woods frequently. This includes 8,250 individual entries and includes data for all but two or three days from March 16 to May 15. We believe this is the best spreadsheet to use for any analytical purpose. However, since we have no strict space limit in the digital version, we present also in the digital version only, a "complete" spreadsheet including data from most observers. We do exclude those checklists with issues described in the paragraphs above. To further provide information to enable evaluation of the information in this spreadsheet, we put numbers in parentheses if there is not a second "confirming" entry -- an entry by another observer with similar number(s). On days when there are no other checklists, if the entry is by one of the core group of observers., it is included without the parentheses. The data in this second spreadsheet in all probability is of very good "auality."

### **Groups of Bird Species Covered**

In this analysis, we focus on species that frequent the habitat at Sabine Woods. We do not cover waterbirds. In general, we only cover a few sparrow species that are commonly present in Sabine Woods.

### **Major Weather Events During Spring 2024**

April 3 Strong north winds behind front, continued into Apr 4 April 21-22. North winds behind front.

### Comments on the Species and Numbers Observed in Spring 2024

Probably the most notable feature of the spring season was the unprecedented number of Blackpoll Warblers passing through. While there certainly were numerous successive days during April when the winds across the Gulf of Mexico had significant easterly components that might have diverted Blackpolls to the west of their normal track, there was not a corresponding increase in either Black-throated Blue Warblers or Cape May Warblers, the two other species that are relatively rare in our area because they favor easterly tracks. A good number of Nashville Warblers, which typically as circum-Gulf migrants migrate north through Central Texas, was recorded

throughout most of April. Easterly winds normally tend to keep Nashville Warblers further west. Perhaps the warbler that attracted most attention was a Lawrence's Warbler, the rarer (recessive) hybrid of Blue-winged and Golden-winged Warblers. A Black-whiskered Vireo present for at least three days in early May was unusually visible.

Despite a good number of Prothonotary Warblers reported in May, late for this species, the overall number was low. Migration of the species tends to be episodic in our area and if the weather made in possible for a large group of the early (March) migrants to overfly Sabine Woods and continue to the breeding areas not very far north of us, that would explain the overall low season total. We thought we were becoming better at finding migrating Swainson's Warblers in recent years, but the low number this year may indicate that the number stopping off was more of a factor than our expertise! Baybreasted Warblers were seen in good numbers, over a much wider time period than we have become used to.
