Saturday August 23. Field trip to Bolivar Flats. Meet leader Steve Mayes at the vehicle barrier at Bolivar Flats at 8:30 a.m. or join the group on the flats later. Take Highway 124 south from Winnie about 20 miles through High Island. At the shoreline, turn right along Highway 87 and proceed approximately 25 miles through Gilchrist and Crystal Beach until you come to the intersection with Loop 108. At that intersection, turn south (the opposite direction from Loop 108) on Rettilon Road to the beach. If conditions permit, drive onto the sand and turn right to the vehicle barrier (about 1/2 mile). It is about 90 minutes drive, with no allowance for stops for birding, from Beaumont or Nederland to the Flats.

(We had tentatively planned a Field Trip to the new J. J. Mayes Trace on the west bank of the Trinity River just south of Interstate 10. However, a scouting trip suggested that a late August trip would not be productive. We will continue to monitor the area for a possible trip in either winter for waterfowl, or April or May for colonial waterbirds).

Just before you reach the bridge over Buffalo Camp Bayou, turn left onto a semi paved road and look for the signs.

Our official chapter territory is defined by zip codes, but is basically Jefferson, Hardin and Orange Counties and one or two localities close to those Counties.

#### Bessie Cornelius 1907-2003

Bessie Cornelius was born June 30, 1907 in Hale, Jones County, Iowa. Her father, Ernest Engle, who was a farmer, taught her the love of nature. He knew about birds and names of various birds. Bessie believes that her father probably learned their names through soda cards that were in each box of Arm and Hammer Baking Soda. The cards had one side that told about the bird and a colored picture on the other side. She thinks that they were from paintings by Fuertes, who was a noted bird artist at that time.

The first binocular bird sighting that she recalls was the Common Flicker on the day she graduated from high school in Lake Benton, Minnesota. From Minnesota, she went to Cedar Rapids, Iowa where she attended Coe College and Cedar Rapids Business College. She also worked in a law office and was appointed Deputy Clerk of U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Iowa where she worked there from 1937 to 1945. She moved to Oklahoma to get married and there worked in the legal department of Governor Robert Ken. She and her husband moved to Borger, Texas where she worked in the District Attorney's office and had a small tax office of her own. It was there that she did her first volunteer work in trying to get Lake Meredith in Fritch, Texas into a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Refuge. She wrote letters to influence congressmen toward that, talked to influential people in the county such as Hutchinson. Her husband had to leave to work in Beaumont, so she never saw the end but worked on it 1954-55.

She was astonished by the number of birds when she came to Beaumont in 1956. She met some birdwatchers and started to go to High Island. In 1958 and 59 she joined some birders interested in saving Smith Woods from development. In 1960 she joined the East Texas Nature Club whose prime interest was conservation of land for wildlife. They got Ned Fritz and his organization, The Texas Committee for Natural Resources to help them. He urged the Nature Conservancy to try and influence the Smith heirs to sell, give, or whatever their property with no luck. "We got Russell Clapper, manager of Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge to talk to them with no luck. I knew Walter Crawford, a local oil man with interests in High Island and he talked with them. They got Eloise Holland, whose mother knew the mother of the Smith heirs, to talk to each one individually. This meant many trips and lots of time, most of it from 1964 on. I suppose I made more than 10 trips until we gave up. I remember of collecting money for Ned's trips and I remember contributing \$100 at one time."

They did get the good will of the Smith heirs and were happy to have us use the property for birding. They also got the Brannons to live on the property as caretakers. This stopped the shooting of birds. Then they began work in 1981 and 1982 collecting money for Boy Scout Woods. Bessie started working at the sanctuary after it was acquired in 1987. She manned the booth at High Island by selling day passes and patches for more than 12 years for Houston Audubon Society. She received an award in 1982 for her volunteer work and money raised. She also received another award in 1993 for her continuing volunteer work. She was named Texas Audubon Volunteer of the Year in 1999.

Other conservation projects she helped bring to fruition included:

- 1. Having Bolivar Flats declared a sanctuary while Stennie Meadours was Houston Audubon Sanctuary Chairman. She wrote letters to Galveston County Commissioners and attended meetings.
- 2. Having Sydney Island in Sabine Lake declared a National Audubon Sanctuary by attending meetings, writing letters, and talking to state representatives at a meeting at Lamar University.
- 3. Keeping Delaware Street Park in Beaumont maintained as a park. She sat out in Kroger's parking lot to pass out flyers. There was a referendum election and they won.
- 4. Promoting US Fish and Wildlife acquisition of what is now McFaddin NWR by attending meetings, passing out flyers, and calling Congressman Brooks.
- 5. Various phases of having the Big Thicket declared a National Preserve by attending meetings at the County Courthouses in Jefferson and Hardin counties, and the Federal Courthouse in Beaumont.

Bessie died in Beaumont on June 10 at the age of 95 after a short illness. She will be sorely missed.

Format: "Common" to "abundant" birds are shown in the fashion "JEF 4 reps(25)" which means four reports in Jefferson County totaling 25 birds. Less than "common", as JEF-SW 7/5(2) ABC", which means seen in Jefferson County (JEF) at Sabine Woods (SW) on the 5th of July, two (2) birds, reported by observer "ABC"

Commentary: Space is at a premium this month as we cram two months' sightings into one issue. We plan on our usual full tabulation

of spring migrants next month. This will make up for the abbreviated reporting of a number of migrants in the May listing. Perhaps the most notable birds reported this time were a good number of "early" Wood Storks in June, following on the heels of an unusual April sighting in Jasper County. With no space for a full "Bird Alert" column this month, we would remark on what appears to be an early start to fall shorebird migration, and on the good numbers of Swallow-tailed Kites being seen. Many of the reports are from Liberty County, outside the area we normally report on, but adding to those reported in the listings below, a number have been seen over Beaumont in July and early August. We also know that in some places – including Jasper County, they have become so common that they are not being reported to us as regularly as they used to be. We look forward to these graceful birds becoming almost common in the years ahead!
