

"Waterbirds and Crawfish - What We Do and Don't Know About Their Interactions"

Dr. J.J. Huner

Jay Huner retired as Director of the Crawfish Research Center at the University of Louisiana in Lafayette in 2005. One of his major projects involved documenting the significance of crawfish pond systems as waterbird habitat with the aim of determining what impact, if any, the birds had on crawfish production. Dr. Huner's studies involved a number of colleagues from Tulane, the University of Mississippi, LSU, and ULL. They demonstrated conclusively that the development of the crawfish industry in southern Louisiana was the primary reason for the geometric increase in wading bird populations in the region over the past 50 years. However, they were unable, through lack of significant financial support, to determine the impact of the birds on crawfish production. That effort remains to be addressed.

Dr. Huner graduated from LSU with a Ph.D. in Marine Sciences in 1975. He worked at Southern University in Baton Rouge from 1975-1988 (Biology Department and Center for Small Farm Research) and at the University of Southwestern Louisiana (now University of Louisiana at Lafayette) from 1988 until his retirement in 2005.

Dr. Huner is also a Docent (Adjunct Professor) of Applied Zoology at the University of Kuopio in Kuopio, Finland. Dr. Huner first went to Finland in 1982 with a fellowship from the Academy of Finland. His work involved studies of crawfish biology and fisheries management in Finland. In 2000, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Natural Sciences by the university based on that work.

Saturday August 25. Field Trip to Bolivar Flats. Meet leader Steve Mayes at the vehicle barrier at Bolivar Flats at 8:30 a.m. or join the group on the flats later. Take Highway 124 south from Winnie about 20 miles through High Island. At the shoreline, turn right along Highway 87 and proceed approximately 25 miles through Gilchrist and Crystal Beach until you come to the intersection with Loop 108. At that intersection, turn left (south -- the opposite direction from Loop 108) on Rettilon Road to the beach. If conditions permit, drive onto the sand and turn right to the vehicle barrier (about 1/2 mile). It is about a 90-minute drive, with no allowance for stops for birding, from Beaumont or mid-County to the Flats.

Important Note: As of this year Galveston County has started the parking permit program on the Bolivar Peninsula. Any one can drive on the beach for free. But if you park on the beach you must have a parking permit on your windshield. The fee for the permit is \$10.00 a year. Apparently, most merchants on the Bolivar Peninsula sell them and you should be able to find a convenience store in Gilchrist that is open as you pass through. Alternatively, you can mail a check to Galveston County Parks Department, 4102 Main (FM 519), La Marque, Texas 77568. Attn Michelle in Parking Permits.

Details of the rest of our Fall Field Trip Program will be decided soon. Please let us have any suggestions for new trips!

Bird Alerts

As fall approaches, the migratory birds that spend the summer with us and nearby start preparing to leave. Purple Martins begin to collect in large roosts, and their settling in each evening can be spectacular. The number of birds in a roost generally peaks in late August and early September. While there are some favored locations across the state used year after year, we do not seem to have such a site locally. However, this year, birds have been seen congregating in the vicinity of the Beaumont Country Club and Collier's Ferry Park, and also in a grove of trees on FM1009 south west of Nome, about 1.5 miles west of the Liberty County line.

It is also time to put your hummingbird feeders out, as the first migrants are already passing through.

Bird Sightings – May and June 2007

Coverage: Jefferson, Orange, Hardin, Tyler, Jasper, Newton, Angelina, San Augustine and Sabine counties. For "very rare" birds, please submit a brief account of your sighting, including a description of the bird (unless unmistakable), brief details of what it was doing, and where it was seen (if on publicly accessible property). Format: "Common" to "abundant" birds are shown in the fashion "JEF 4 reps(25)" which means four reports in Jefferson County totaling 25 birds. Less than

"common", as JEF-SW 7/5(2) ABC", which means seen in Jefferson County (JEF) at Sabine Woods (SW) on the 5th of July, two (2) birds, reported by observer "ABC." The range of dates for which the species was reported is shown in parentheses in a column before the sighting details or report summaries.

Commentary: Two months this time, and not much space available for commentary. The results below represent good numbers of migrants in early May, and quite a few sightings of nesting birds in the Big Thicket, both during the our Field Trip and during other trips to the area.. A Gray Kingbird was seen at the Sea Rim Willows June 2.
